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<u>Community Forum Feedback – 9/29/15</u>

The following information was obtained during Community Forums held on one evening in the Elementary cafeteria, with approximately 51 people attendance. After review of some district information (available in a powerpoint), attendees were broken into small groups and asked to identify priorities of the six goals in Comprehensive Local Education Plans. Below are those responses. The number in () indicates the number of persons who selected that item as one of their top three priorities, out of everything listed. Those with no number were discussed during brainstorming but determined not to be a top priority.

GOAL 1: Provide quality curriculum and instruction that prepare all students for the future using <u>a variety of methods including technology</u>

- College readiness for HS, add classes (5)
- Less emphasis on testing, more on learning (3)
- Updated textbooks, iPads, chromebooks (2)
- Online textbooks/technology (2)
- More age appropriate curriculum (1)
- Life skills for "real life" situations for Jrs and Srs,, ie budgets, checking accounts, etc. (1)
- Go back to old school math curriculum (1)
- Training for literacy across the curriculum
- Textbooks
- More concurrent classes
- Increase athletic class choices
- Stronger partnership with OSSM
- Less emphasis on lesson plan construction
- Quality Staff Development to train teachers for technology classes and AP
- More diversity: language classes (ie Spanish, German)
- More hands-on activities: gardening
- Creative approach to learning
