

Senate Bill 346 is a law which relates to school assessment; to the Reading Sufficiency Act; providing for retention, and prohibiting social promotion. The law was signed by the Governor on May 4, 2011. In accordance with Senate Bill 346 by Senator Clark Jolly and Representative Sally Kern, Hilldale Public Schools will need to post on our website what we are doing for students with reading deficiencies and the policies and procedures of the School District on student retention and promotion.

We are to also post on our web page:

- By grade, the number and percentage of all students in grades three through ten performing at the unsatisfactory level on the reading portion of the statewide criterion-referenced tests;
- Be grade, the number and percentage of all students retained in grades three through ten;
- Information on the total number and percentage of students who were promoted for good cause, by each category of good cause as specified in the District's Promotion and Retention Policy, and
- Any revisions to the policies of the School District on student retention and promotion from the prior year.
