Sympathy vs. Empathy Difference

(according to Merriam-Webster)

Sympathy is when you share the feelings of another; *empathy* is when you understand the feelings of another but do not necessarily share them. When a friend grieves over the loss of a loved one, you might send that friend a sympathy card. The card says that you are feeling sad along with your friend because your friend is grieving. The sentiment behind *empathy* is often presented in the familiar saying "to put yourself in another's shoes".
