The free application for federal student aid, or FAFSA, is available beginning October 1, 2021 for the 2022-2023 academic school year! Don't wait, apply today.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED TO APPLY:

- Social security number and driver's license
- Your 2020 Federal tax information or tax returns (can be retrieved through the IRS Data Retrieval Tool)
- Alien registration information (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income
- Account and investment balances
- Your FSA ID (your FAFSA username/password)

SUBMISSION OPTIONS:

- Electronic form (easiest and most secure option)
- Mail-in application (download PDF at fafsa.gov)
- Electronic submission by your college/career school (if applicable)

Once your application is submitted, your official Student Aid Report or SAR will be emailed to you and your information will be sent to the colleges you list on the application. Save the SAR to use on our scholarship and others!
